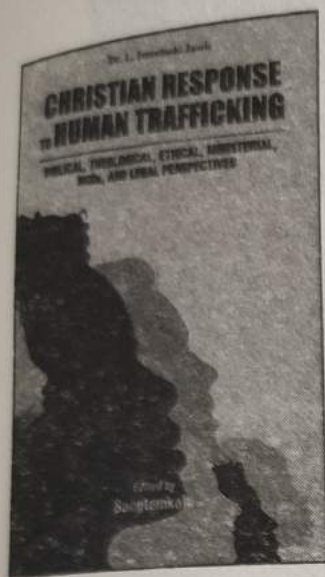

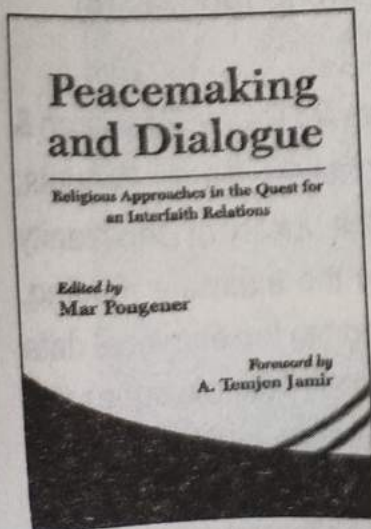

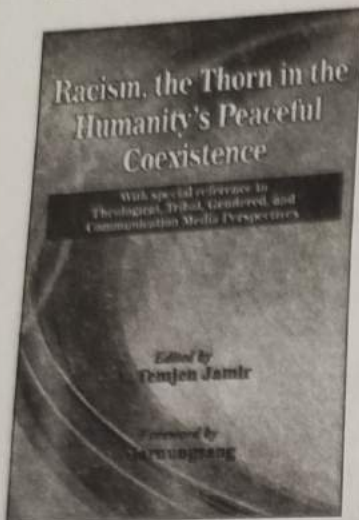


3. **Peacemaking and Dialogue: Religious Approaches in the Quest for an Interfaith Relations (pub. 2018)**

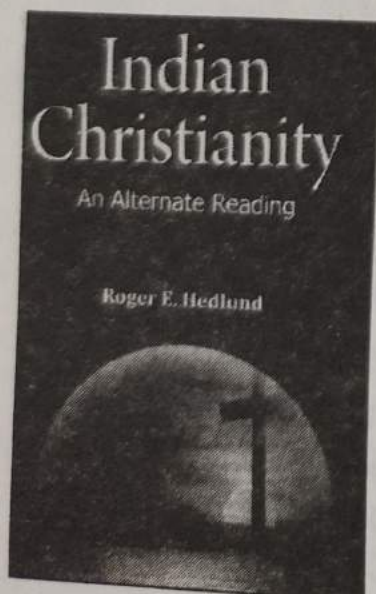
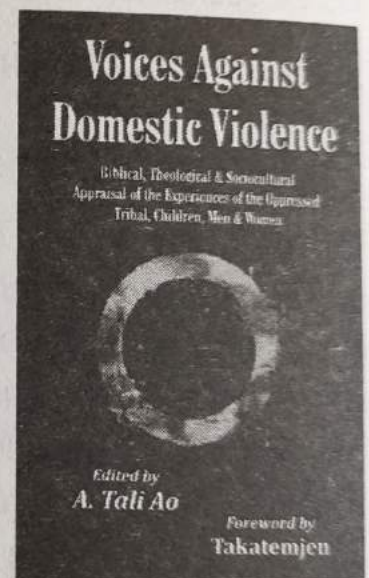

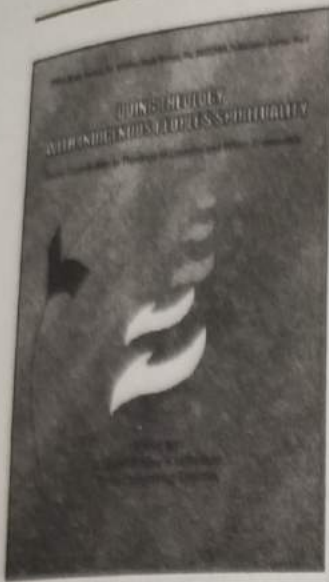
5. Voices Against Domestic Violence (pub. 2016)

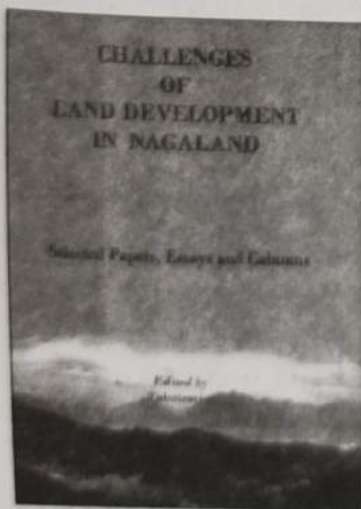
**7. *Doing Theology with Indigenous People: Asian Contribution to Theology of Creation and Wider Ecumenism* (pub. 2016)

Edited by L. Imsutoshi Jamir, A. Temjen Jamir & C. Temjen Longkumer

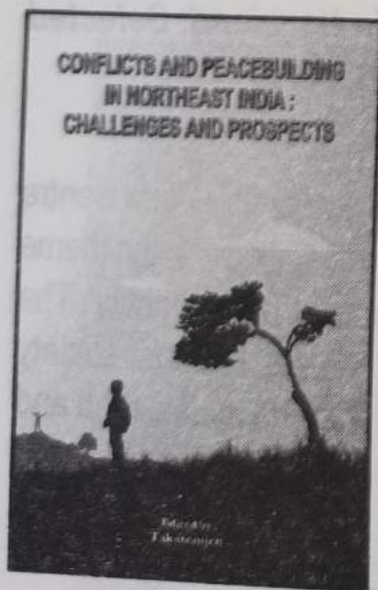
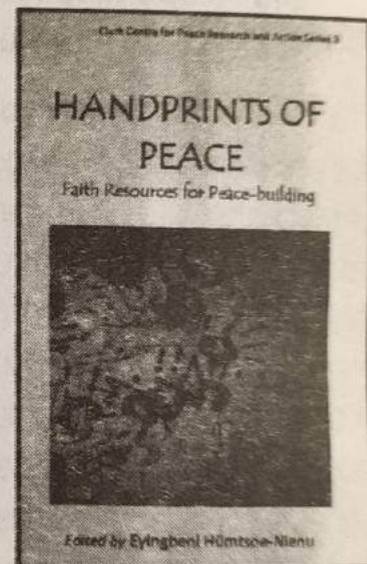
